The Golden Acorn

The 87th Infantry Division during World War II

The Battle of the Bulge, crossing the Rhine, German Concentration Camps

Fred Whitaker served with the **87th Infantry Division** in the European Theater of Operation during WWII. He was the point of the Army spear because he was an infantry soldier. The 87th Division, the Golden Acorn Division, served in the Ardennes, the Rhineland and Central Europe. The Division landed in France on November 1944 and was in combat on December 1944. In the Army, the King of battle is the Artillery, the Knight of battle is the Armor and the Queen of battle is the Infantry. The queen is the most versatile piece on a "chess board", and the infantry is the most versatile forces on the battlefield. The Infantry does everything and

anything and is the most dangerous force out there. Fred should know as he fought in the in the biggest battle in Europe: Battle of the Bulge. The weather was freezing, foggy and muddy. It was so cold that four medics were carrying a wounded soldier on a stretcher, dropped him. Upon examination, all the medics had black feet-frozen- and couldn't walk any further. The Germans launched a surprise attack and overran many US front line troops. Strange things happen in war. Fred's Battalion was pulled back from the front for reorganization and rearming. It was December 25th, Christmas, and the troops were fed a hot meal including turkey drumsticks. Returning to the front, German fighters strafed the column, wounding Fred. He remembers waking up in the hospital and a doctor asking him how he was doing. Fred, who was served a second Christmas dinner, said, "It doesn't get any better than this."

When the 87th Division crossed the Rhine River, it was at night. The Germans lite up the sky with flares and caught them crossing. The first wave had 80% casualties, the second wave had 40% casualties and the third wave had 20% casualties. However, the US troops successfully crossed and pushed the Germans back.

Germany used concentration camps as prisons for political prisoners and undesirables without judicial process. Once in the camps, the people were worked to death or starved to death or both. The Buchenwald concentration camp was liberated in April 1945. The German citizens were ordered to walk through Buchenwald, to see what terror and death had been happening in this camp.

Fred's best memory of the war was when a group of 87th Division veterans returned to Belgian fifty years later. As they walked down the street, little children came out, took their hands, and thanked them for their sacrifice. [What a great day to be an American soldier!](#)
