Special Presentation



Colonel Joe Mueller, USMC (Ret.) shared with the Freedom Committee of Orange County his tour of duty in Iraq 2006-2007. The **Iraq Assistance Group (IAG)** was a U.S. military command underneath Multi-National Corps-Iraq that coordinated military transition teams assigned to **the Iraqi Security Forces (ISF)** including the Iraqi Army, Federal Police, Department of Border Enforcement, Ports of Entry Directorate and

provincial police. These teams provide partnership, mentoring and training to assist their ISF partners in achieving full operational effectiveness and facilitating the transition of internal security to Iraqi control. The Iraq Assistance Group itself was a joint command formed from the U.S. Army's 1st Infantry Division and composed of mostly Army soldiers but also including a sizable contingent of sailors, airmen and one Marine Colonel Mueller as well as members of foreign militaries.



The Iraq Assistance Group and the transition teams it supported played a pivotal role in the success of the coalition strategy in Iraq which has made possible the planned redeployment of all US forces in Iraq in accordance with the U.S.-Iraq Status of Forces Agreement.

Colonel Mueller stated that there is a large cultural environment that will limit bringing the Iraqis up to our level of training. Colonel Mueller's living quarters were in an air-conditioned trailer with tall barricades for protection. When he traveled in conveyors, the Engineers preceded them with a Combat Engineer Vehicle to detect and clear road mines. His impression of his tour was, "We won the war but no so good at winning the peace".

On 3 June 2009, the Iraq Assistance Group ceased its colors and its functions and personnel were merged into Multi-National Corps-Iraq.

The **table is round** – to show our everlasting concern.

The **cloth is white** – symbolizing the purity of their motives when answering the call to serve.

The **single red rose** reminds us of the lives of these Americans...and their loved ones and friends who keep the faith, while seeking answers.

The **red ribbon** symbolizes our continued determination to account for them.

A **slice of lemon** reminds us of the bitter fate of those captured and missing in a foreign land.

A **pinch of salt** symbolizes the tears of our missing and their families who long for answers after decades of uncertainty.

The **lighted candle** reflects our hope for their return – alive or dead.

The **Bible** represents the strength gained through faith in our country, founded as one nation under God, to sustain those lost from our midst.

The **glass is inverted** – to symbolize their inability to share a toast.

The **chair is empty** – they are missing – (silent moment) – and please remember their service and sacrifice.

Let us honor America's POW/MIA's and encourage our government to undertake successful efforts to account for them.
