This meeting was devoted to coordinating efforts to integrate Military Veterans into the curriculum of local schools. **Dr. Chuck Hinman**, Assistant Superintendant, Newport-Mesa Unified School District; and four High School Principals were present. **Dr. Hinman** addressed the Veterans and stated Newsweek listed the *Newport-Mesa Unified School District High Schools* in the top 6% of the 22,000 High Schools in the Nation. Compared in size and demographics, their graduation rate in four years is the highest in the Nation.

He recognized a missing component in the Education Program; a connection to Military Veterans and their contributions to our Nation. First recognized by **Dr. Norman Loats,** former Assistant Superintendent and FCOC member, an effort was started to connect Veterans and the students, and to permit the student to hear history as it was lived. Freedom Committee combat veterans not only tell their stories but also bring memorabilia for viewing.

The solution to the missing component will be lead by **Denise Wieland**, who will be the Community Facilitator for all four High Schools. Her task will be to bring military Veterans into the classroom and allow the Veterans to relate to the students. In addition, an effort will be made to record the stories of "our Veterans" before they are lost.

Jack Hammett, Chairman of FCOC, introduced a film that could be presented to the students as an introduction to the FCOC Living History Program. This 22 minutes film, "45 Wars" was shown in its entirety to all present.

MTHE has over one-thousand historical interpretive specialists representing many different aspects of world history from Ancient Rome, to Elizabethan England, to Colonial America and beyond. The timeline starts with the beginning of the civilized world and marches its way through history to the current conflicts in the universal War on Terror.

MTHE is a family-oriented, educational atmosphere, celebrating the history of those who have defended their civilizations throughout history. Visitors are invited to walk through the camps of the participants and learn about the lives of the common man or woman.
