David Hayward was trained as pilot flying the B-25 "Mitchell" two-engine bomber.



After being awarded his wings, Dave received his overseas orders for the China-Burma-India Theater. Reporting for duty required flying from Florida south to Brazil, then East across the Atlantic Ocean to

Morocco, and ending in India, approximately 12,000 miles. The last journey was a five-hour flight over the "hump" Himalaya Mountains to Yangtze, China. Dave joined the 22nd Bomb Squadron, 341st Bomb Group, 10th Army Air Force. The mission of the American Air Force was to supply the Chinese troops and tie-up Japanese forces in South East Asia.



Flying his first combat mission, which was a target in Mandalay, Burma, on April 8, 1943, a large Jap squadron was spotted flying in the same direction as his squadron but at a lower altitude. Pushing the throttle to maximum, his plane could not out fly the Japs. A lone "Oscar" fighter climbed to his altitude and closed. Looking out the side window, Dave could see the Jap pilot flying *parallel* to his plane. No one fired and soon

the Jap dove away and rejoined his squadron. Don't ask why, just say thanks. The 22nd Bomb Squadron bombed bridges, locomotives, railroad yards, and other targets to delay movement of supplies to the Japanese troops fighting in northern Burma and French Indochina. Dave's squadron bombed airfields in Hanoi and Da Nang, now Vietnam.

1LT Dave Hayward is credited with 53 combat bombing missions. He has also authored several books: "A Young Man in the Wild Blue Yonder", and "Thoughts of a B-25 Pilot". He has returned to visit in southern Main Land China six times to a warm welcome for WWII Vets.
